The novelist-critic Takami Jun describes it as a rare jewel among masterpieces of modern literature. The novel reveals how the family system of Meiji Japan (1868-1912) leads to an exploitation of the women and treats various problems which the protagonist Tomo Shirakawa faces. The role of the concubines provides a profound double structure. The novel is a fictional transformation of Enchi's grandmother Ines painful life who endured a polygynous marriage with a man from a samurai family. The protagonists suffering and pain expresses Enchi's own protest against the system and the maltreatment of women. First published in pieces in journals, it came out in a book form in 1957. During that time women were resisting the government to reintroduce the traditional Japanese family system. Enchi published several critical novels in the...
